The Fort Frances Curling Club was a busy place on Saturday as the 7th Annual Gun and Hobby Show organized by Scott and Tasha Stafford welcomed over six hundred and sixty people who came to check out the sixty exhibits ranging from collector guns to antique guitars, vintage snowmobiles, gardening supplies and handmade laundry soap.

Gun enthusiasts were there to buy, sell or trade their col-

lectibles including an Alberta Tactical Rifle that was going for \$4,500.00.

The family-run show attracts exhibitors from Thunder Bay, Manitoba and Minnesota.

"We are supported very well from across the District too", noted Scott Stafford.

Visitors could be seen checking out the various rifles that are used for hunting, target shooting and collecting.

Evelyn Bragg was helping her husband Ray who is a

"collector of everything", she said.

Loewen's Greenhouse was there with a display of flowers and plants to prepare for the upcoming season of flower and vegetable gardening and Pat McPherson was promoting his 3rd Annual Vintage Snowmobile Show/Swap coming up this fall on September 6th at the Point.

He had a collection of vintage snowmobile parts, including snowmobile suits.

"I became obsessed with snowmobiles" he said as to his motivation in collecting old snowmobiles.

"I would like to restore the vintage snowmobile club in Fort Frances", he explained adding that he has the original patch for the group.

Gary Somerfield came from Thunder Bay to display his collection of military medals.

"It's a fascinating hobby", he enthused as he showed me his grandfather's World War I medal.

He has medals dating back to 1843 from the Victorian years, engraved with the name, rank, serial number and unit of the celebrated soldier.

Other exhibits included Nature's Heart Photography, Steeped Tea and a fundraising bake sale for SCAP. The Emo Walleye Tournament was there to promote their upcoming event and Stan and Christine Barta travelled from Manitoba to showcase their variety of collectibles.

"We've been coming every year for the last five years", said Christine who also travels with her husband to various shows in Manitoba and Calgary.

"We really enjoy coming to this one", she said. "I come for the plants from Loewen's. They have the best patio tomato plants. Very nice. Very healthy", she enthused.

Mike Dressaire was visiting from Dryden and came to see the show for the first time.

"I've never been to a gun show before so I came to see

their handmade items.

"The items must be handmade in order to sell them on the page", she explained adding that the site is doing very well with 560 members to date.

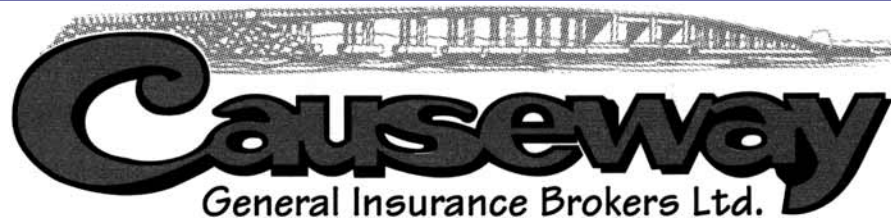
